Chinese Y.M.C.A. Secondary School is committed to providing students with diverse learning experiences. By cooperating with overseas institutions, sending students to train abroad and actively organising overseas exchange programmes, our school aims to broaden students' horizons. The school also promotes Chinese culture on the campus to help students enhance their national identity.

### Professional Aviation Training Programme for Students in Australia

The school is committed to training aviation talents and organising a variety of courses for students to learn aviation knowledge. Last year, we cooperated with the Hong Kong Productivity Council to jointly organise English Aviation Operations (Ground) and Aviation English Basic Courses. Recognised by the Qualifications Framework, the course covers aviation pilot training and air traffic training. The school also co-organises the Future Pilot Programme with overseas (Australian) universities. This course allows students to experience flying physical aircraft overseas, which is also recognised by the Qualifications Framework. This year, the school is planning to expand enrollment and allow more students to participate in flying real aircrafts.

## Balance in Students' Academic, Physical and Artistic Development

Last year, our students achieved excellent results in HKDSE, with one student obtaining 5\*\* in six subjects. Apart from academic development, our students also win awards and prizes in Sports and Arts. They actively participate in off-campus competitions and rank top in inter-school sports competitions and Hong Kong open

#### Promote Chinese Cultural Day and Multi-Cultural Day to Enrich Students' Cultural Knowledge

Dr. Cheung said, "Students lost a lot of opportunities to experience various activities during the pandemic. Therefore, the school has organised multiple activities in hope of compensating for that."

In order to enhance students' recognition of their national identity and promote Chinese culture, the school held Chinese Cultural Day this year which allowed students to understand the culture of their motherland, broadening their world horizons. On Chinese Cultural Day, students wore traditional Chinese costumes - Hanfu, weaved grass and tried folk snacks. The school not only invited local organisations to perform Cantonese opera and face-changing shows but also encouraged students to organise their own booths to promote Chinese culture to their schoolmates, using diversified activities to deepen their understanding of the Chinese culture. A booth with the theme of "Descendants of the Dragon" designed by the students themselves not only enabled them to gain cultural knowledge but also strengthened their organisation skills and creative thinking. Dr. Cheung pointed out that the students were actively

involved in the activities and said they were deeply intrigued by Chinese culture. When the school later conducted a questionnaire survey on cultural promotion, some students even took the initiative to ask for information about the Belt and Road Initiative.

In addition, the school also held Multi-Cultural Day, which exposed students to customs, languages, arts, music and

food from around the world through workshops, stalls and talent shows. The activities fully demonstrated different cultures and expanded students' worldview inside and outside the school, not only enabling them to learn, understand and respect other

cultures but also promoting an inclusive and harmonious campus.

#### Obtain International Certification Strive for Multiple Paths

The school provides Cambridge English Language Certification and Assessment for students who intend to take international examinations and to improve their English proficiency. Besides, examinations including GCE A Level, IGCSE and GCSE (General Certificate of International Secondary Education) courses are offered to help students adapt to overseas studies in advance. In addition, students can also be trained at school to take TOEFL and IELTS. Language learning enrichment courses are also incorporated to improve students' language abilities comprehensively.

#### Organising Overseas and Mainland Exchange Tours to Understand Motherland History while Broadening World Horizons

Dr. Cheung hopes that students can experience the history and culture of their motherland and strengthen their understanding of the country, while at the same time deepening their understanding of its modern development and national identity. This year, the school has organised mainland tours to Xi'an and Northeast province. For example, students went to their sister school in Xi'an for exchanges where they skipped rope, enjoyed music performances and danced to experience the local culture.

The school has organised overseas exchanges to broaden students' international horizons, such as a study tour to Switzerland and Germany. Dr. Cheung shared the details of the American Adventure Camp which has been held in Asheville and Greenville in the United States to help students experience American culture and strengthen English learning. At the same time, students who are into aviation will also have the chance to participate in an aviation training course in Australia in the summer holiday.
